Some of our learning this week:

Adventurers have been exploring counting on to add numbers using lots of different resources and Miss Matthews has been very impressed! They have also created their own art prints based on a painting by Kandinsky.

Discoverers have been learning about The British Isles and it's surrounding seas. They have also enjoyed working with the Adventures on Kandinsky art prints.

Explorers have been very creative this week, working together to produce their Greek God display.

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Inventors have started beautiful sketch book work, drawing and painting planets; showing expertise in colour mixing, brush work and 3D techniques.

Our collective worship has had a community focus this week with the children learning about what makes a great community, both in school and out in the wider world.

In family groups the children created a community web, sharing their thoughts and feelings about how it feels to be joined together as part of our Swimbridge School community.

As autumn approaches we are preparing for our Harvest Service which is planned for Friday 5th October in the Parish Church at 2pm; all are welcome. Instead of harvest produce, it is a Swimbridge tradition to collect money which will be used to help change the lives of the poorest and most disadvantages children in the world. Historically we have funded children



through Action Aid and we are proud to say that the children we have sponsored have grown and thrived from our contributions over the years. From this September we are sponsoring a new child, his name is Mamadou and he is 4 years old. He lives in Missirah in southeast Senegal, in the district of Tamcacounda, one of the poorest regions of Senegal. Children are encouraged to bring monetary donations in an envelope to the service to help us raise the £250 sponsorship needed to support him.

Can I reassure parents of children in years 1 and above that although we would like all children to wear our grey school logoed jumpers and cardigans wherever possible, we are happy for the children to continue to wear their woollen un-logoed grey jumpers and cardigans until September 2019. The new blue PE kit (logoed polo shirt and logoed hoodie) is the required PE Kit for every child unless their old red kit still fits. All children will be expected to have the blue kit from September 2019. Any parents wishing to purchase the logoed jumpers and cardigans can do so directly from the school office, online through School Threads (free delivery to school) or from MJM Sports, Bideford.

What is a Parent Teacher Association (PTA)?

Most schools have a PTA; here at Swimbridge we like to include friends of our school, therefore we are known as the <u>PTFA</u>: Parent, Teacher & Friends Association. It is an organisation of parents, family, friends & staff. The role of the PTFA is to encourage closer links between home and school. The PTFA is best known for its fundraising work, but we have useful social functions too. Fundraising events provide an opportunity for parents, staff and pupils to get together.

How is the PTFA organised?

At our school all parents/carers and staff are automatically members of the PTFA. The AGM (Annual General Meeting) takes place in October, close to the start of the school year. At this meeting a Committee is elected to run the PTFA – consisting of a chair, vice-chair, a treasurer and a secretary, with other parents/carers volunteering to be 'class reps', where they pass information from the PTFA to other parents in their child's class. The PTFA Committee usually meet once a half term to organise events and everyone is welcome at these meetings.

How is money raised?

We, as a PTFA raise money through events and activities that run throughout the school year: Examples include the Christmas fayre, Easter bingo, summer fete, children's discos, cake sales, as well as many other events. The PTFA are always open to new ideas and new fundraising activities.

How is the money spent?

Funds raised by the PTFA are intended to provide 'extras' not already provided by the school's main income – often 'fun things' that make learning more interesting and exciting. As well as these extras, the PTFA contributes to extra curricula activities, event/sport transport hire, theatre events, playground equipment, with larger two to three year projects to enhance the school of all pupils.

How can you be involved in our PTFA?

There are many different ways you can help with our PTFA, whether you have lots of time to offer or not. If you can't commit to a 'big job', look for things you can do less frequently e.g. running a stall at the summer/ Christmas fayres, baking cakes etc. and you can always support our PTFA events by simply turning up.

* If you would like to be on the PTFA but are worried that the meetings are at the wrong time, please do come to the AGM—the meetings can be moved to after or during school or whenever suits the new team, it is whatever works for the committee!*
